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# The Role



Sheffield Doc/Fest is looking to contract an industry professional to help manage our various partnerships with organisations from the film / TV / documentary / arts world - and to develop new ones.

The successful candidate will have a track record in attracting sponsorship from a range of businesses, in developing projects in collaboration, and in executing agreements, working closely with Sheffield Doc/Fest's Director of Partnerships & Development and across all Festival teams.

This contract can be fulfilled on a freelance, part-time, basis, either from Sheffield or London, but must be available to deliver over the festival period: 4-9 June.

# Key Responsibilities

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- Deliver on Doc/Fest's strategy to build brand and corporate partnerships with organisations whose values and work aligns with our own;
- Raise funds in the industry sector and develop partnerships with documentary, digital and other media organisations and businesses;
- Maintain existing and established partnerships, and nurture new key relationships within the industry;
- Pitch for new programmes with international partners to encourage year round and Festival activity;
- Work together with other members of the management team to ensure that all sponsorship opportunities are being explored in their teams;
- Create pitch documents for sponsorship packages and pitching to relevant companies, including existing sponsors and new sponsors;
- Attract sponsors for promotional materials such as branding of items, for example; bags, festival badge, delegate centre and content of delegate bags;
- Identify and manage contracted sponsorships from all Festival suppliers (including media, marketing, production etc), including their contractual agreements and ensuring appropriate delivery;
- Support the Director of Partnerships & Development with research, and grant applications, and report writing;
- Service all existing sponsors at the festival and year-round events and ensure their satisfaction with their investment before, during, and after;
- Ensure the proper acquittal of all sponsorships, including providing relevant statistical information;
- Manage and deliver all sponsored and supported launches, events and functions;
- Work with the Events Team/ Venue Coordinators/Volunteers during the festival;
- Debrief with, and prepare reports for, sponsors and funders;
- Attend and feed in to the post-festival Debrief.

# Person Specification

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- Previous experience in a similar position in income generation within the film / broadcast / documentary industry;
- Track record of raising cash sums through sponsorship;
- Able to negotiate with sponsors and the film industry;
- Ability to communicate at all levels and highly skilled in public speaking and presentation skills;
- Experience and knowledge of, and passion for, current developments in documentary – in cinema, on television, and online, both within the UK and internationally.
