

OPEN CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The ongoing pandemic shows us that the film industry as a whole needs to transform itself by quickly adapting to disruptions within the audiovisual sector. At **NEXT WAVE**, we are addressing these changes by analysing emerging developments in the media landscape and beyond, enabling our participants to understand the core of innovation and create their own future business models. The **9-month intensive professional training programme**, run and designed by the DFFB and co-funded by Creative Europe MEDIA and Medienboard Berlin Brandenburg, researches current market trends, facilitates interdisciplinary dialogue between film professionals and empowers its trainees to rethink the future of cinephilia and international film markets.

For our next edition we are on the lookout for young, ambitious professionals from the fields of film marketing, sales, distribution, exhibition and programming. The main requirements are relevant documented working experience of three to five years in the film sector, a creative, collaborative and entrepreneurial mindset and a willingness to gain in-depth knowledge of the industry, to build a professional network and to develop own strategies for future innovations in film markets. An excellent standard of spoken and written English is essential as all classes are taught in English. The recommended age is 25 to 35 years. NEXT WAVE will take on up to 15 European participants (in exceptional cases up to three applicants from non-European countries will be accepted).
